GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS NOTICE: FOR BOBCAT CLASSIC PROSPECT SHOW

All exhibitors, parents, sponsors, youth leaders, Agriculture Science Teachers (A.S.T.) and other interested parties are cautioned to carefully read and understand the following Rules and Regulations, as they will be enforced.

1. The BOBCAT CLASSIC, and Texas State University Collegiate FFA Officers reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, in connection with, or incident to, the BOBCAT CLASSIC Prospect Show.

2. In no case shall the BOBCAT CLASSIC, TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY, nor any of the show officers or volunteers, be held responsible for any loss, injury, death, or disability from disease, or from any cause, to any person or property while said persons or property is on the show grounds.

3. The Collegiate FFA Officers reserve the right to refuse to accept for exhibit any entry and to remove from the show grounds any entry that may be falsely entered or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable. Any animal showing definite symptoms of disease or parasite infections will be banned from the show and ordered removed from the ground by the respective division superintendent in accordance with rules and regulations of the Texas Animal Health Commission.

4. Participation in the BOBCAT CLASSIC Prospect Show is for students who are at least four (4) to seven (7) years old in the peewee division and under 2nd grade (at the date of show) 3rd grade (8 years old) through 12th grade in high school, and who are members of 4-H or FFA including Junior FFA.

5. Students with projects to be entered in the BOBCAT CLASSIC SHOW must have their entry cards turned into us by 8:30am the day of, after animal weigh in. Entry forms mailed in after the specified date (November 1st, 2019) will pay the regular entry fee plus a \$20.00 late charge. Entries will be accepted during the week of the show (November 24th to November 30th, 2019) prior to the posting of division classes the day of the show at a fee of \$50.00.

6. Gates will open at 4:30 am on Saturday for livestock. All animals are to be in assigned stalls at all times except when in the show ring, wash rack or being exercised. Tie outs will be allowed in designated areas for cattle only.

7. Swine will be released at the conclusion of the Swine Show and Heifers will be released at the conclusion of the Heifer Show. Goats, Steers, and Lambs will be released at the conclusion of the Prospective Show. Early release of any animal requires the approval of the respective Texas Collegiate FFA officer.

8. Exhibitors must show their own projects, with the following exceptions: a. When an exhibitor has more than one entry per class, a substitute exhibitor may be used. The substitute exhibitor must have an entry in the BOBCAT CLASSIC SHOW. Any other exceptions must be approved by the Texas State Collegiate FFA officers of the BOBCAT CLASSIC PROSPECT SHOW.

9. All exhibitors in the BOBCAT CLASSIC PROSPECT SHOW are expected to cooperate with show officials to present their exhibits.

10. All steers, goats, lambs, and swine will be weighed at the times designated by the division superintendent. The OFFICERS will provide the scales for weigh-in.

11. The exhibitors will provide all feed. No hay or straw may be used for bedding in barns. Wood shavings will be allowed in all barns. No shearing will be allowed on the show grounds.

12. All animals must be owned and in the exhibitor's possession and under that individual's care at the specified date for ownership. Each exhibitor is responsible for the care and preparation of their animals for exhibit up through the show dates.

13. Ear tags must stay attached on all animals while on the show grounds.

14. Exhibitors, and/or their representatives, may not spend the night on the show grounds. Only authorized individuals will be allowed on the grounds after 11:00 pm and before 4:00 am.

15. Unethical fitting: Unethical fitting means any attempt to alter the natural appearance, confirmation, musculature or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. Animals showing any signs of being unethically fitted will be disqualified. Examples of unethical fitting include, but

are not limited to the following: a. Application of any substance to any part of the animal's body, unless specifically allowed in the department rules for that species. b. Use of injections. c. Draining

of fluids. d. Bruising. e. Feed of material not conducive to the health of the animal, safety of food or marketability of its carcass. f. Surgical alterations. g. Artificially filling animals by stomach pumping or airing injections.

.16. Any person violating any of the Rules and Regulations, without express written permission of the division superintendent, or general superintendent, may forfeit any prize money he or she might have won and the privilege to show at the Johnson County Livestock Show and Youth Fair, and at all later shows.

17. All protests must be submitted in writing to The Texas State Collegiate FFA Officers, and be accompanied by a protest fee of \$50.00 cash, before any action will be taken. The fee will be refunded to the protesters if the ruling is in their favor.

18. All no-show will not be allowed on the show grounds during the Prospect Show.

19. There will be two (2) Classifiers present at weigh-in for Steers, Swine, & Lambs. Classifiers decisions are final and non-protestable. Classification will follow the Texas FFA/4H classification guidelines.

20. Only Exhibitors will be allowed in staging areas for the Livestock shows. No one except for exhibitors or ring assistants will be allowed in entry alleys to the show ring. The Texas State Collegiate FFA reserves the right to remove anyone from the staging area. If the request to leave is denied security will kindly remove persons.

21. Defamation and Slander of The Texas State Collegiate FFA will not be tolerated on any platform. Defamation is when a party makes reputation ruining false statements of fact, about a person, product, or business. The statements can be written (libel) or spoken (slander).

a). Made a false statement or fact about the plaintiff to a third party;

b). Made a statement that caused the plaintiff reputational or material harm; or acted either negligently or purposefully. Texas also has a defamation charge known as “defamation per se.” It refers to some statements that anyone would, or should, know are likely to injure a person’s reputation. These statements include accusations of moral turpitude, criminality, or allegations involving a loathsome disease. Within 90 days of the initial offense, the injured party requests that the publisher or speaker retract or remove the material. The accused can ask why the retraction or removal is necessary or appropriate. If the accused agrees to retraction or removal, it must be done in the same manner as the original. If persons are

found to be guilty of defamation and slander, the Texas State Collegiate FFA, and The University reserves the right to prosecute any guilty party.
